#### **BOARD MEETINGS**

## **ANNUAL PRACTISING CERTIFICATE RENEWALS**

The online renewal process ran well again this year with just a very small handful of automatic APCs not generated at the time of payment. APCs were produced and sent from the office and we apologise for any inconvenience caused by those delays.

## CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT (CPD)

The current Framework was introduced last year and if you have not already had a look please read it on this link <u>here</u>.

All CPD is now required to be logged online in your practitioner portal and CPD records will be closed off at the end of 31 December 2019. Audits will commence in early 2020.

Practitioners who have not completed their CPD requirements for the 2018/2019 cycle will be automatically included in the 2020 audit.

All practitioners in the 2020 audit will not be advised until after the CPD records have been locked at the end of the year, therefore it is essential that CPD is logged during 2019 in order to be able to claim CPD hours.

### **CPD Reminders**

The 4 CPD categories are:

- Compulsory: 8 hours minimum of:
  - Infection control
  - Wound management 2 hours

3 hours

- Cultural safety 3 hours.
- professional communication
- professional learning
- basic life support.

#### **Professional Communication**

A few suggestions for CPD in this activity:

- An audit of an area of your practice, as listed in category five of page 8 of the new framework
- Depending on your area, organisation of a network meeting. If there are a few practitioners in a rural area then why not form a network via Skype or Face Time.
- Present a clinical case to one of your remote colleagues via skype or FaceTime or by phone.
- Present an area of practice to your local allied health or medical practitioners, this will enhance network formation.
- There are now many online CPD events, these can cross over from professional learning into this category.

# PRINCIPLES & STANDARDS FOR THE PRACTICE OF PODIATRY IN NEW ZEALAND (PSPPNZ)

This important new document on the Principles and Standards for the Practice of Podiatry in NZ has now been adopted by the Board and is available <a href="here">here</a>.

The Board would again like to thank all stakeholders who provided feedback on both the first and second consultations for this document.

#### PRESCRIBING UPDATE

The Board is progressing with an application to the Ministry of Health for Designated Prescribing Rights, and has appointed a project manager to move this forward.

A full stakeholder list is being compiled, further contact with the Ministry being made, an education package is being developed and a proposed list of medicines is being finalised.

The Board would like to thank all those who provided responses on the <u>draft list of medicines consulted on</u> recently.

Practitioners will be updated with any further progress on this important project.

**REMINDER:** The Board would like to remind all practitioners that Medsafe and Medicines Control permits podiatrists to use up to 2 percent lignocaine **only**.

Please note the prescribing and use of Marcaine, Ropivacaine or Bupivacaine is not permitted by podiatrists or podiatric surgeons in New Zealand.

The Board has made a recent <u>application to the Medicines</u> <u>Classifications Committee for the reclassification of both</u> <u>Bupivacaine Hydrochloride (Marcaine Plain and Marcaine with Adrenaline) and Ropivacaine Hydrochloride (Naporin)</u> and is awaiting the MCC decision.

## Cost of Treatment Regulations

ACC has advised of <u>new rates for treatment providers</u> effective since December 2018

ACC has developed a <u>new position statement</u>. They advise it clarifies their position and provides guidance for allied health professionals who work under the Accident Compensation (Liability to Pay or Contribute to Cost of Treatment) Regulations 2003.
