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## **Privacy Act 2020 - How it affects you**

The Privacy Act 2020 came into force on 01 December 2020 and it is important that all registered podiatrists are familiar with the changes and how they impact your operations.

The biggest change is that reporting a serious privacy breach is now mandatory. For example, if you are responsible for a breach of privacy that could cause serious harm to clients, you are legally obligated to report this to the Office of the Privacy Commissioner and to the affected individuals. One example of a breach of privacy would be leaked personal patient information that could be used in identity theft or published online.

The Privacy Commissioner also has new powers to help people access their own information and to require businesses and organisations to comply with the law. If a patient requests personal information held by a business, the business cannot destroy the information in order to avoid providing it. Also, if you are using service providers based overseas, like cloud software, you will need to ensure that those providers are meeting New Zealand privacy laws.

There are increased fines for organisations that don't comply, and there are also new rules when sending personal information overseas. You can find out more about the changes and how to report a privacy breach [here](#).

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## **Continuing Professional Development (CPD)**

All practitioners should now be familiar with the new CPD framework outlined via the link [here](#). The Board will be sending out a CPD Survey soon requesting

your feedback on the current process so we can continue to make improvements.

Please remember to record your CPD hours online, using the login and practitioner portal. The current CPD cycle is 01 January 2020 to 31 December 2021 and audits will commence in early 2022.

### **Allied Health Services Contract**

The Board are aware that ACC have proposed the integration of physiotherapy, hand therapy and podiatry contracts under one Allied Health Contract. It is a proposal at this stage with any changes subject to their internal approvals, but likely to come into effect on 01 November 2021. Updates on this proposal are being provided by ACC via their Allied Health Provider Updates, which you can sign up for directly and on the [Government Electronic Tender Service \(GETS\) website](#). ### **Registration**

In support of our new graduates, the Deputy Chair conducted a presentation at AUT in October to advise students on the Boards role and on their responsibilities as registered health professionals under the HPCA Act 2003. The Registrar and Registration and Recertification Officer also took part in a zoom meeting with the AUT students organised by PodiatryNZ in November to ensure an efficient registration process for the graduates. Some of them have already been issued with their first APC and started work on 01 December 2020.
